Project details

-Publication of the complete works of the Austrian legal theorist Hans Kelsen (1881-1973) in approx. 32 volumes -Historical-critical edition with double footnotes apparatus and thematic registers

-Transfer of the previous print publication into a hybrid edition: analysis of the editing process and transformation of the pre-digital into a digital workflow


Project goal

-Publication in printed and digital form, using a digital working environment

-Open Access (CC BY4.0) and sustainable usability of digital research data (moving wall principle)

-Interoperability of the digital edition

-Contribution to an ontology in digital jurisprudence (LOD)

Data Modeling

-XML according to the guidelines of the Text Encoding Initiative (TEI)

-Modeling of entities, of text structures and registers -Linking norm data (e.g. GND) and reference management system (Zotero)

Digital Infrastructure

-XML-based edition environment in the oXygen author editor -Extensional frameworks based on ediarum as well as the eXist-db app ediarum.db

-XML database eXist-db

-Deployment of TYPO3 CMS for kelsen.online

-Further prospect: implementation of the digital edition on kelsen.online
