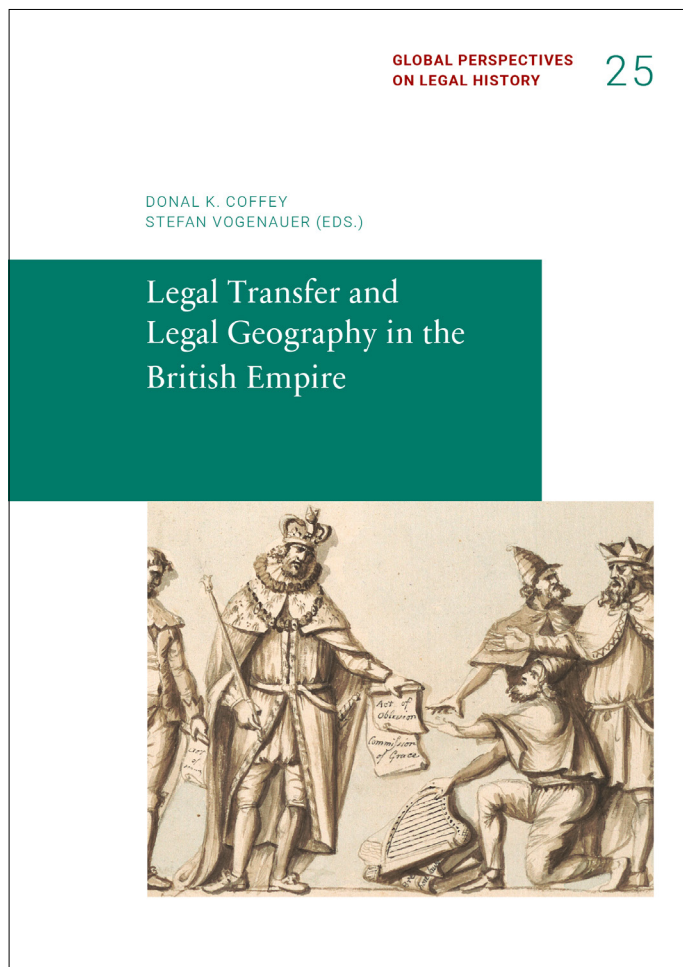




## GLOBAL PERSPECTIVES ON LEGAL HISTORY
